## Notice of Funding Availability and Proposed Rule

### ***New Funding for Incarcerated Veterans Transition Program, Supportive Services for Veteran Families***

Washington, DC

May 5, 2010

The U.S. Department of Labor and the Department of Veterans Affairs have released a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the Incarcerated Veterans Transition Program and proposed a rule for the Supportive Services for Veteran Families Program, respectively.



- ◆ The U.S. Department of Labor, Veterans' Employment and Training Service (VETS), announces a grant competition to fund at least **12 Incarcerated Veterans Reintegration Program (IVTP) grants designed to support incarcerated Veterans "at risk" of homelessness**. The application deadline is June 4, 2010. Click [here](#) to view the full announcement.
- ◆ The Department of Veterans Affairs is seeking expedited comments by June 4, 2010 on the proposed rule implementing the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) Program. The purpose of the SSVF Program is to **provide supportive services grants to private non-profit organizations and consumer cooperatives who would coordinate or provide supportive services to very low-income veteran families** who are:
  1. are residing in permanent housing
  2. are homeless and scheduled to become residents of permanent housing within a specified time period
  3. after exiting permanent housing, are seeking other housing that is responsive to such very low-income veteran family's needs and preferences
